Scott Gordon is the first player in University of California-Davis golf history to earn his PGA Tour card. A one-under score of 71 in 45 degree temperatures and 12 mph winds on the final qualifying day at Orange County National Golf Center in Orlando earned Scott a T27th and playing privileges on the 2011 PGA Tour.

Scott's determination was evident from the beginning of his Q school journey in early October. Unable to practice until September due to a wrist injury, he nevertheless played through 3 tough qualifying stages to gain one of the final qualifying spots at 9 under.

"It's amazing what he did." said Cy Williams who coached Gordon during his All-America career at UC Davis. "He's really worked hard. For him to hold up over six rounds against the best players is impressive. We're very proud of Scott's accomplishment."

After a successful career at UC Davis that culminated in his selection as the school's "2004 Male Athlete of the Year", Scott played on the 2008 Nationwide Tour and qualified for the 2010 Nationwide Tour until injuries sidelined him for the year.

Scott now looks forward to the opportunities and challenges of the 2011 PGA Tour. When not pursuing those opportunities, Scott enjoys time with his family. His father, Kerry, and mother, Mikel, follow his career closely as do his sisters, Tiffany and Jessica. Scott's girlfriend, Linsey is also a big supporter.
